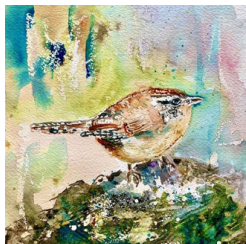


Wednesdays April 5 - May 17 | 4:00pm - 6:00pm

Each robin has a unique red breast pattern and their hops in front of the yellow daffodils are an iconic announcement of spring.

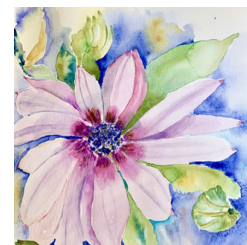
May 3: Bluebird 'n' Blossoms

Lively cherry blossoms will bring life to the wings, tail, beak and more of the pretty blue bird.



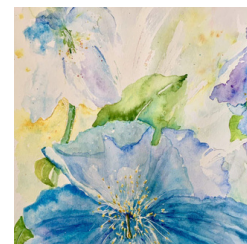
May 10: Marguerite Magnifique
