The award-winning robots from Troy area First Robotics teams will be back to demonstrate innovations in programming and inspire the next generation of car designers. The Troy Historic Village tent will connect you to our automotive past through hands on activities for all ages and Sparkles the Clown will be painting faces again this year. You'll be able to catch lunch while you're at the Traffic Jam and cool off with an ice cream treat if the day gets hot.
